

We have the pleasure to confirm that the Swiss Agency for Development Cooperation, acting as a representative of the federal government of Switzerland, has decided to fund and support the implementation of the Young Water Fellowship Programme 2018 – 2020.

The programme empowers young community leaders from low and middle-income countries to set up social enterprises that address water, sanitation and other water management issues in their local communities, by providing them with training, mentorship and seed funding. It is carried out by the two organizations Young Water Solutions Aisbl and cewas. Annually, 10 young leaders are selected based on merits, leadership potential and the quality of their project plan to tackle water issues in their communities. They are invited to attend the one-month cewas' Start-up training programme from August to September, where they benefit from an intensive workshop in Willisau (Switzerland), followed by networking opportunities in Stockholm (Sweden; World Water Week) and Brussels (at the EU institutions). Afterwards, upon returning to their communities in their respective countries, they receive the financial support required to implement their local initiatives.

The successful implementation of this program will not only contribute to achieving the Sustainable Development Goals, but also increase local capacity to tackle water issues. The young people selected are community leaders determined to solve water issues in their own communities in the long term.
