

Report on Army Attachment with 6 JAK RIF

From March 17 to March 28, 2024, we had the unique opportunity to be attached to the 6 JAK RIF in Dalhousie. This attachment provided us with a comprehensive understanding of infantry operations and an experience in military life.

Participants-

The camp was attended by 88 cadets from various universities, including 2 cadets from Shoolini University, Total of 13 cadets from 1 HP NCC BN SOLAN. Additionally, 88 cadets from respective units across Himachal Pradesh participated in the camp.

Activities Overview

1. Drill and Sports

We participated in regular drill sessions that emphasized discipline, precision, and coordination. In addition to drills, we engaged in various sports activities, which served to enhance our physical fitness and foster camaraderie among the participants.

2. Classes on Infantry Operations

A series of classes were conducted by experienced officers, covering various aspects of how an infantry operates. These sessions included:

- The role and functions of an infantry unit.
- Tactical maneuvers and battlefield strategies.
- Motivating stories of Indian army soldiers.

3. Touring the Unit

We were given a tour of the 6 JAK RIF unit, where we observed the battalion's daily operations and facilities.

4. Ambush and Patrolling Exercise

We were involved in a practical exercise focusing on ambush and patrolling techniques. This exercise simulated real-life scenarios, allowing us to apply theoretical knowledge in a controlled environment. Key aspects included:

- Setting up an effective ambush.
- Conducting patrols with an emphasis on stealth and reconnaissance.
- Coordinating movements and communication within a patrol unit.

5. Weapon Showcase

The unit organized a detailed weapon showcase, featuring various firearms and equipment used by the infantry. This included a hands-on demonstration of the 5.56mm INSAS rifle, among other weapons like ATGM, 81mm Mortar, advance night vision binoculars and cameras and the new 7.62 SIG rifle, we were briefed on the technical specifications, handling procedures, and maintenance of these weapons.

6. Basics of Night Navigation

Unfortunately we couldn't practically perform night navigation but the officials briefly explained us how night navigation is done.

7. Battle Obstacles Course

We participated in a battle obstacles course designed to test our physical endurance, agility, and problem-solving skills.

8. Firing with 5.56mm INSAS Rifle

A practical firing session was conducted, allowing us to experience shooting with the 5.56mm INSAS rifle.

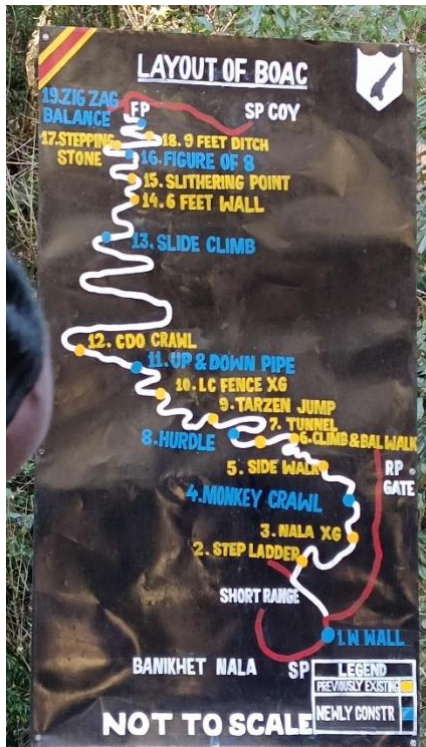
9. Cultural Program and Movie Night
