

**STUDENT EXCHANGE AGREEMENT BETWEEN
UNIVERSITAS MUHAMMADIYAH YOGYAKARTA (INDONESIA) AND
THE SHOOLINI UNIVERSITY (INDIA)**

UNIVERSITAS MUHAMMADIYAH YOGYAKARTA (Indonesia), with principal place of business at Jalan Brawijaya, Tamantirto, Yogyakarta, Indonesia, of the first part, represented by its Rector appointed acting on behalf of Universitas Muhammadiyah Yogyakarta;

AND

SHOOLINI UNIVERISTY (India), with principal place of business at Solan-Oachghat-Kumarhatti Highway, Bajhol, Himachal Pradesh 173229, India, of the second part, represented by its Vice Chancellor appointed acting on behalf of Shoolini University.

ARE IN AGREEMENT

That, in order to strengthen the cooperation between the institutions that they represent and, thus, contribute towards giving a more international approach to the studies taught therein, in the framework of the Agreement for Mutual Cooperation between both institutions, agree to the following international student exchange in the following terms:

FIRST. OBJECTIVE.

The aim of this specific agreement is to establish an exchange programme and the conditions to be applied to exchange students between the Shoolini University and Universitas Muhammadiyah Yogyakarta.

SECOND. EXCHANGE CONDITIONS.

The exchange of students will be regulated according to the following terms:

1. **Participants:** Students eligible for exchange shall be enrolled on undergraduate and graduate courses offered by both universities during the academic year in which the exchange takes place.
2. **Duration:** The student(s) selected will take part in the exchange programme for a period of one semester or one academic year.

3. Number of participants: There will be an exchange flow of four (4) students per academic year (or eight (7) if the period of exchange is for one semester), unless another figure is specifically decided by both institutions.
4. Reciprocity: Both institutions will revise the number of exchange students every year and will try to reach a balance in flows during the period in which the programme is active.
5. Selection of participants and admission:
 - Students to take part in the programme will be selected by the home institution, which will take into account, according to its own criteria, the academic performance and level of studies achieved by each candidate.
 - All exchange students must meet the academic and linguistic demands of the host institution. The host institution reserves the right to decide upon the eventual admission of each student, after revising whether said student fulfils all requirements.
 - Acceptance of students onto the programme corresponds to the host institution, which will take into account the mobility (im)balance, the number of places available and the host institution's capacity to receive the student(s).
 - Once the student(s) has/have been accepted by the host institution, they will have the same rights and duties as any other student(s) enrolled at the host University.
6. Financial details and medical insurance:
 - The student(s) taking part in the programme will pay all academic fees at the home institution and will be exempted from paying enrolment fees at the host institution.
 - The exchange student(s) will only have to pay the fees established at the host University for certain services (i.e. books), under the same conditions as any other student enrolled at the University. In such case, the host University must inform the student(s) beforehand.
 - Any travel, accommodation, living, medical insurance and other related expenses will be paid by the student(s), unless both institutions previously agree to cover some, or all, of these costs. However, the host institution expressly agrees to offer information to the student(s) to find accommodation for the duration of the stay.
 - All students must take out health and travel insurance for the duration of the study period.
 - Mobilities will preferably be financed from external funds, provided that the candidates/students fulfil the conditions required to receive such funding. In case external funding is not possible, the conditions laid down in this agreement will be guaranteed.

7. Services offered by the host institution:

- Both universities agree to provide the exchange student(s) with the necessary preparation to make sure that the study period runs smoothly and fruitfully, through each institution's general and international relations services.
- All exchange students will have the right of access and to use all services offered by the host University, in the same conditions as the institutions' own students. The host University agrees to inform the exchange student(s) of the availability of such services.

THIRD. ACADEMIC COMMITMENTS.

1. Any student taking part in the programme and accepted by the host University, will have the right to register for the regular studies offered by said institution for a maximum period of one academic year. The student(s) may register for the maximum number of credit points admitted by each University and must comply with same academic rules that apply to all other students registered for the same studies.

2. The host University has the right to limit, in coordination with the Faculties or Schools involved, the courses that may be followed by the exchange student(s) if needed in order to facilitate the reciprocal academic recognition of the studies followed by the exchange student(s).

3. Entry onto any specific course or subject will depend on whether the student(s) fulfil(s) the academic and administrative requisites, along with the number of places and the conditions established each year.

4. At the end of the study period, the home institution will issue a transcript of records to each student, specifying the number of credits taken, the duration and the grades obtained.

5. Both parties agree to accept the studies followed in the host University as equivalent to those of the home University, within the limits established by the legal regulations of each country and of each University itself.

FOURTH. COORDINATION

The persons who are academically responsible for international relations in each institution, or those officially acting on behalf of said persons will be responsible for the coordination of this agreement.

If other specific exchange agreements are signed under the framework of this agreement between those persons responsible for specific study areas, the exchange co-ordinators appointed by the Faculty or School where those study areas belong will be responsible for the coordination of that agreement.

- a) has been made public by the disclosing Party or by others with the permission of the disclosing Party;
- b) is independently received from a third party who is free to disclose it;
- c) is in the public domain or is a compilation of material in the public domain; or
- d) required by laws or competent authorities.

EIGHTH. DISCREPANCIES

Any discrepancy, conflict of interest or problem which results from the implementation or interpretation of this agreement shall be resolved in first instance by the members of the Joint Committee and in second instance by their respective Rectors or their designated representatives.

Whenever no mutually agreed solution can be adopted, the parties hereto agree and consent to subject any differences arising from this agreement to the jurisdiction and exclusive competence of the courts of the defendant party, expressly renouncing recourse to any other possible jurisdiction.

This agreement should be concluded in two original documents, both written in English language and being equally authentic.

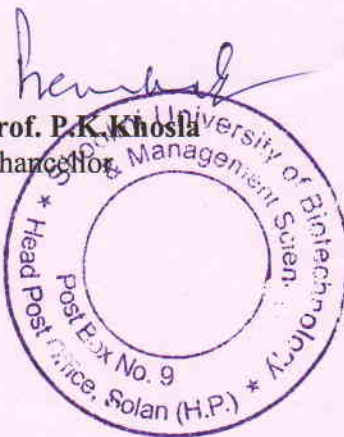
